## **Subject: Submission of Treaty Proposal on Global Peace, Security, and Human Development**

Your Excellencies,

I am a **permanent resident of the United States (green card holder)** and a committed advocate for global peace and human development. I respectfully submit for your consideration a **comprehensive Treaty Proposal on Global Peace, Security, and Human Development**.

This proposal presents a **structured global agreement** aimed at eliminating armed conflict, freezing international borders, reducing military expenditures, and redirecting resources toward humanitarian development and global well-being.

The proposal recommends a **phased 50% reduction in global military expenditures**, with **25% allocated to a United Nations–managed global security force** and **25% retained for national defense**. The remaining resources would be redirected toward addressing critical global challenges such as hunger, healthcare, and education. Based on current global data, this approach could:

- **Save approximately 10 to 15 million human lives per year**
- **Generate savings exceeding \$1 trillion annually.**

This proposal envisions a unified global commitment in which all countries, including Member States of the United Nations, participate in a **phased and progressive manner**, allowing initial adoption by willing States and **gradual expansion** toward universal participation.

# AGREEMENT ON GLOBAL PEACE, SECURITY, AND HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

---

## Preamble

The States Parties to this Agreement,

Recalling the purposes and principles of the United Nations,

Recognizing the ongoing impact of armed conflicts and global instability,

Acknowledging that nearly one billion people suffer from hunger and that the World Food Programme faces funding challenges,

Determined to eliminate war and promote sustainable development,

Have agreed as follows:

---

## Article 1: Universal Ceasefire and Non-Aggression

All States Parties shall cease armed conflict and refrain from aggression.

---

## Article 2: Recognition and Freezing of Borders

All existing international borders shall be recognized as final and inviolable.

---

## Article 3: Global Border Monitoring System

A global monitoring system shall be established under the United Nations.

---

## Article 4: Legal Commitment

This Agreement shall be binding on all participating States.

---

## Article 5: Enforcement

Violations shall result in sanctions and legal accountability.

---

## **Article 6: United Nations Global Force**

States shall contribute 25% of weapons to a UN-managed force.

---

## **Article 7: Military Expenditure Reduction**

- 50% reduction in military spending
  - 25% to UN force
  - 25% for national defense
  - Remaining funds redirected to development
- 

## **Article 8: Continuous Enforcement**

The United Nations shall ensure enforcement and rapid response.

---

## **Article 9: Humanitarian Protection**

States shall protect civilians and support hunger eradication through the World Food Programme.

---

## **Article 10: Phased Adoption and Global Expansion**

1. This Agreement shall be open to all States.
  2. Implementation shall begin with a **Coalition of Willing States**.
  3. Additional States may join at any time.
  4. Participation levels:
    - Full Members
    - Partial Participants
    - Observers
  5. The United Nations shall facilitate expansion.

**Article 11: Global Participation**

This Agreement aims for universal participation through progressive adoption.

**Article 12: Cooperation and Peacebuilding**

States shall resolve disputes peacefully and cooperate globally.

---

**Article 13: Entry into Force**

This Agreement enters into force upon adoption by participating States.

---

**Article 14: Amendments**

Amendments require majority approval.

---

**Article 15: Depositary**

The Secretary-General of the United Nations shall serve as Depositary.

I have been engaged in humanitarian, peace-oriented, and development-focused initiatives for more than two decades. My earlier initiative, *United Developed India*, received recognition at the highest levels. I was honored to receive an encouragement letter in 2003 from **Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam**, former President of India, acknowledging and appreciating my efforts toward national development.

In addition, I have been recognized for public service contributions through the following awards:

- **Government of India – National Award (1999)** for National Service Scheme (NSS)

- **Madurai Kamaraj University Award (1998)** for NSS
- **Government of Tamil Nadu Award (1999)** for NSS

These recognitions reflect my longstanding commitment to public service, humanitarian development, and global peace initiatives.

My work has progressed through two major phases:

- **2003–2023:** Development and promotion of the *United Developed India* initiative

#### **Annexure 7: Future Phases and Projected Plan**

**Phase 3:** Outreach to remaining G20 countries and additional regional partners.

**Phase 4:** Global outreach to all remaining United Nations Member States, with the aim of ensuring that every country has the opportunity to review the framework.

**Timeline:** These phases will be undertaken progressively, based on responses received during Phase 1 and Phase 2. The timeline is flexible and will be adjusted according to the guidance and feedback from governments and international institutions.
